Ever since our beginning, the focus have been on assisting people that otherwise would not stand a chance to receive urgently needed support. One such instance was that of a

gentleman that for 3 years running had been on the lookout for a set of crutches. We were able to assist him. Another, of a mother with 3 children that came and asked for money to buy food. We have always been very hesitant to accommodate situations like this unless we knew the person or family well. Here we took a chance and about 30 minutes later the person came back quite emotionally to show us what she had purchased. Now there was food for her and the family for a while. It is hard not to assist.

This year, Bob and I were fortunate to have our spouses come along to support us as well as to visit a few historical



sights in Granada and Masaya. One can only come back with memories for a lifetime...

In the past year we have shipped or brought with us items i.e. Clothing Material, School Books and Supplies, Blankets, Medical tape, Hygiene Items, Eye Glasses, Plumbing Supplies, Wheel Chairs, Walkers, Crutches, Laptop Computers, Software, PC-Parts, Router with Table, and Hand Tools.

It is our hope that you will continue to be part of our team efforts in Nicaragua. If you are so inclined, the opportunity exists for making a journey to Nicaragua to see for yourself how dire the situation really is.


