GREAT JOURNEY WITH MANY ACCOMPLISHMENTS...

On this, the 19th Humanitarian Trip to Nicaragua, we were well prepared and ready to complete our projects. This year we were asked to assist with a new and somewhat urgent project in addition to what was already planned. We managed to accomplish this by relying on our team in Nicaragua. Without the support that we receive from many sources our work would be much more challenging. Both Bob and I feel good about the outcome on this journey.

This year we experimented with the dates for our travel to possible improve our access to school administrators and teachers. We found out that it makes very little difference and therefore we will revert back to the October/November schedule starting this year. The next trip marking the **20th Humanitarian Journey** will be: **November 4th to November 18th, 2015**.

The following requests were approved since our last journey to Nicaragua: Roofing sheets - 62 (not including the school building in Las Esquinas), Eye Exam and Glasses for 10 year old with troublesome eyes., New roof (437.85 m²) including some wood and paint. We have currently a few projects on hold pending further assessment.

Food and other supplies i.e. 300 eye glasses were delivered to 5 Senior Care facilities in Diriamba, Jinotepe, San Marcos, Masaya and Granada. 4 Schools in Las Esquinas, Los Marqueses and San Marcos (2) received much needed school supplies. Please read the comments from the recipients that also serve to inform us about future needs.

Another task was to deliver a book written by a Chicagoan titled: SO I BOUGHT AN AIR FORCE to the Municipal Library in Chinandega. The book was inscribed by the author, Mr. Will W. Martin who had an emergency landing in 1967 on the coast about 20 miles north of Corinto. Corinto is 12 miles from Chinandega and this was during the Somoza regime in Nicaragua. The book is factual and inspiring to read.

It was well received because of its relevancy to the region and to Nicaragua's history. Corinto is a busy port city where most of our humanitarian shipments arrive before going to the WNP's warehouse in Managua for pick-up by either Rodolfo Aburto or Jose Herrera.

Reflections by Robert M. Anthony on the 2014/15 Humanitarian Journey:

We want to thank friends, family, and in some cases businesses that have supported our efforts to help others. They place a trust in us to use those funds wisely and we strive to maintain that trust. We are always thankful for a trip that provided few hurdles in getting supplies to Nicaragua and in delivering those supplies. Our ability to do that is due in no small part to two families, Jose Herrera and his extended family, and Rodolfo Aburto Castellon and his family. Jose is involved with our transportation and translating with recipients. Rodolfo also is important with transportation and helping us to identify specific needs. Rodolfo's family helped us to identify the essential supplies needed to replace the school roof and helped to organize community members to complete the roof replacement prior to the beginning of the school year (their school year begins in February and ends in November). This continues to be a group effort to help families in Nicaragua and we are very grateful for all those who participate.

Only 5 out of 12 PC's are currently working. We have in the past shipped flat-panel Monitors and Desktops to Nicaragua but we are also exploring local resources.

Also, with us this year were Natalie Alexandra Szulyk and Marie Louise B. Nielsen. This enabled us to bring more humanitarian supplies to Nicaragua as well as they assisted us with the distribution etc. Thanks to both.

Natalie and Marie also made time to visit San Juan del Sur, a resort town on the Pacific Coast near to Costa Rica for a few days prior to returning to the United States. Bob and I look forward to seeing them again in Nicaragua.


