Having returned from the 21st Humanitarian Journey to Nicaragua, we are very pleased with the outcome. To our supporters, on behalf of the recipients: A Big THANK YOU!

Since 1995, the focus of our activities in Nicaragua have not changed. There is nothing on the horizon to indicate that we must or should change the course. The demographic data available today, does confirm that we still going in the right direction. We, along with numerous other NGO's and organizations, such as ours are plugging away at making the day-to-day living more tolerable for the approximately 70% of the population that find themselves in dire situations. For our supporters and us it has always been important to be part of something bigger than ourselves which we set out to demonstrate on each journey to Nicaragua.

This year the main focus were centered on five Senior Care Facilities and five Schools from Kindergarten and up in the Carazo, Masaya and Granada regions. School supplies were purchased and will be delivered in early February 2017 when the next school year begins. Eventual comments from these will be posted on our web-site when received.

Three shipments of humanitarian items ranging from School supplies, Bathroom sink & Mirrors, Shoes, Wheel chair, Crutches, Walkers, Adult diapers, Leg/Neg braces, Computers and Printers has been shipped this year. The aforementioned School supplies to be delivered in February were purchased locally in Managua, the capital. We, thankfully also received a substantial discount on these items. We inspected and approved several projects that was initiated after our departure from Nicaragua in 2015.

The assistance that we receive in Nicaragua from the Rodolfo A. Castellon and Jose S. Herrera families are of immense benefit to us in enabling us to be more productive while there. *Thank you.*
